All Literature classes at HHSW include a strong writing component. Grammar should be mastered by the end of high school, if not sooner.
Social Sciences U.S. History, World History, World Geog, Government & Economics, European History					3-4 years required. Govt-Econ are combined in one year. Other choices are political science, philosophy, psychology, and sociology.
Math Algebra 1 and 2, Geometry, Advanced Math, Consumer Math, Calculus, Accounting, Logic					3-4 years recommended. Algebra and Geometry are generally required. Advanced Math is recommended.
Science Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Earth Science, Physical Science, Anatomy & Physiology					3-4 years recommended. Biology and Chemistry are usually required. Should include lab work.
Foreign Language Spanish, French, and Latin offered at HHSW. Sign Language may be accepted by some colleges.					Some colleges require 2 years of the same language. 4 years of the same language in H.S. often fulfills many 2 year requirements of a foreign language at many colleges.
Fine Arts Art, Humanities, Music (Choral, Orchestra, Dance) and Drama					1 year recommended, more if planning to major/minor in the Fine Arts.
Physical Ed P.E. Classes, Sports, Driver's Ed					2-4 years recommended.
Electives Keyboarding, Computer, Sewing, Woodworking, Study Skills, Etiquette, Business & Career Classes					A computer class is recommended. Typing skills are a necessity.
